This 3 and a half months-long project consists of a seven-day youth exchange as its main activity. Its main aim is to enhance the comprehension of today's global environmental issues. The main topic of the youth exchange is 'environment' and 'art & culture'. Using various forms of art (such as Street art: graffiti, Art from trash, Fire art & design, Underground Comix, VJ visual video art: Audio-visual Art and VJ Culture, Unconventional Lamps & Lighting Designs, Stencil art, Printing art on t-shirts, Lone, Wood and stone carving, Dijeridoo, Percussion) and culture we will provide a learning space for youth with fewer opportunities. Four promoters from four countries (Albania, Hungary, Romania and Serbia) will take part in this activity where we will host 20 participants. The venue place will be at a rural community camp near Subotica, Serbia between 1st to 9 September 2009. Objectives of this youth exchange are: -promotion of art and culture as tools for dealing with and learning about environmental issues -inclusion of young people with fewer opportunities in active participation in future projects? -promotion of rural sights and environmentally-friendly ways of everydayliving -learning about global environmental issues and finding ways of dealing with these issues on a local level Through structured thematic workshops and with the use of non-formal education by the inclusion of art & culture as tools, we will provide a safe learning-space, where participants can creatively, freely, and open-mindedly share, discuss, comment and express through art their understanding and learning of environmental issues in an intercultural setting. Media literacy is a new approach to non-formal education, addressing contemporary realities of young people, that provides them with a framework for accessing, analyses, evaluation, creation and participation through mediation of messages in variety of forms. The focus of the training course will be the promotion of cultural diversity and the reflection of the concept of European citizenship - what defines the concept of active citizenship and how much is Europe portrayed as inclusive or exclusive. The project will start in August 2009, and the activity will be held in November 2009 in Belgrade, Serbia. The objective of the training course will be improving skills and competencies of the volunteers/youth workers/ trainers from EU and neighbouring SEEU and EEC countries for delivering courses and workshops in youth media activism and media literacy. The activities will be based on critical examination of traditional and new media as tools for fighting prejudices and xenophobia, as well as on the improvement of participants' understanding of the creative potential of media as devices in promoting European awareness - respectively through dissemination of good practices and promotion of youth activism, human values, cultural diversity and social awareness. The practical implementation of the training will be focused towards, capacity-building, exchange of experience and good practice and introduction of innovative practices that combine interest in European awareness, media and youth work.

The training project is focusing on creating the base of facilitation skills needed for youth leaders in youth exchanges, with the special consideration of different learning processes taking place in a youth exchange, from preparation of individual groups, through facilitation of the course of a youth exchange, all the way to wrapping up overall learning experience and setting foundations for further personal development of

A special emphasis is being put on continuous facilitation approach to intercultural learning, active involvement of youngsters at every step of the way and developing creative and original methods throughout. The training project has 3 integrated learning phases: 1)Preparation for the course through distance e-learning; 2) 9 days training course taking place on Fruška Gora Hill, in Serbia; 3) Follow-up to the course through distance e-learning. Methodology used in all its phases is based on active participation and experiential non formal education methods, framed by the core intercultural learning process. "Facilitation Beyond Frontiers" is scheduled to take place in autumn of 2009, with 24 young people coming from 10 different countries -Albania, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Czech Republic, Italy, Latvia, Macedonia, Montenegro, Portugal and Serbia.

The naked truth about xenophobia drawn by young comic artists</p>	<p>Strip it! Is a 9 day youth exchange held in Belgrade, the capital city of Serbia in the third week of September 2Q 2009. It gives young and creative comic writers of 5 different European countries the chance to explore the power of the image as a communication tool in getting to know more about other cultures and countries. The project revolves around the theme of European Superheroes. Participants from Spain, Serbia, Czech Republic, the Netherlands and Croatia create, throughout the week, comics and cartoons in which the so-called European Superheroes represent common European values like tolerance and liberty, while European Villains represent common concerns such as xenophobia and prejudice. The objective is to experience European cultural diversity first hand, and to learn to appreciate these differences while also exploring our common values and shared cultural beliefs. The superhero genre fits the objective perfectly: the black-and-white moral world of the superhero. Belgrade is chosen as venue, because the city has been be the blooming centre of the Ex-Yugoslavian comic-writers-underground, it is the urban crossroad of different European cultures, such as the central-European, the oriental, Mediterranean and Slavonia Eastern and offer therefore the perfect</p>

								ambiance to cultural diversity. Other planned results and follow-ups of the YE are the publication of the stories, written and drawn during this YE, and the start of an internet community of young European-minded comic-writers from all over the continent. This internet community will have a space where comic writers can keep in touch, comment on each others' work and get inspired to develop new ideas and stories.

Youth media programmes focus on the ways in which the young people can use the power of media to express their opinions that often go unnoticed in the mainstream media networks. They also explore the potentials of media to promote young people's personal growth and development. With young people under the age of 24 making up half of the world's population, their perspectives on current issues and events are not only valuable and insightful, but essential to informing key decision-makers about the impact of their actions on the young people. In order to take advantage of the full capacities of the media power and to facilitate the distribution of socially engaged media productions many networks have been established during the last years between youth media NGOs. However the cooperation with NGOs from East and South East Europe has been limited. The current partnership-building activity will focus on developing the platform for dissemination and implementation of good practices, competences and skills for youth media projects bringing together youth workers from the programme countries and neighbouring EU partner countries. The goal will be the expansion of existing media networks to include East and South East European countries, the networking of youth media organizations for the exchange and mobilization of EVS volunteers and the development of co operational projects, especially inside the YIA Program.
