The theme of the training course is: to promoting social cohesion, social inclusion through volunteering; to meet, share own values and this way to build a partnership with other youth workers with whom they should build a multiplier network on promoting European awareness, social inclusion and volunteering; to contribute in developing high quality and innovative projects in Youth in Action Programme; The main aims and objectives of the training course: building tolerance and mutual understanding among young people; developing and understanding about aspects of active youth participation - volunteering; to be aware of importance of cultural and linguistic diversity and raise sense of tolerance and understanding other cultures; to promote European citizenship, and to make participants aware of their responsibilities as European citizens; to explore the power of non-formal learning and Youthpass; to provide young people an intercultural learning experience, encouraging social – integration; to offer the opportunity to meet partner groups and develop concrete ideas for future projects focusing on social inclusion and volunteering. The methods and methodology of the TC is based on non-formal learning. Group members will experience process of cultural principles such as dialogue, mutual understanding, giving constructive feedback, decision making, self-exploration, attitude of analytical approach.

The project's duration:10 working days. Objectives: -To train group leaders and youth workers from EU and SEE countries and give them the capacity to use multimedia as a tool in promotion of mobility of unemployed youth and youth with fewer opportunities, as well as developing skills in promotion and implementation and launch of new quality projects, both within the framework of the Youth in Action Programme and on the local level. -To raise awareness about importance and possibilities offered by youth mobility schemes, with particular reference to European Union's mobility programmes -To improve and quality of future YiA Programme projects developed by partner promoters -To give to the participants a tool for multiplying the competences gained during the TC at local level, in order to involve and empower young people This TC focuses on the sustainable aspect of youth mobility. Partner promoters put an emphasis on preparatory work done by participants in advance, including collecting of examples of barriers to youth mobility, outcomes of youth mobility schemes for young people that participate in them, and problems of mobility for youth with fewer opportunities. Non-formal education will be the backbone of the methodology used during the training. It will include icebreaker dynamics, an association fair, working sessions on Multimedia in Non Formal Education, Intercultural learning workshops, presentations on Mobility of Unemployed Youth, Multimedia Workshops, presentation of the Youth in Action Programme, working sessions on future projects, field visits, intercultural evening, open space workshops. Reflection and learning outcome groups will be led every day in order to check together with

Ten years after the war in former Yugoslavia, there is a willingness to discuss the past conflicts as a part of the process of democratisation and Europeanization of Serbia. This project will include a group of 24 youth (12 from Serbia and 12 from Germany), 16 to 25 years old, in a weeklong creative workshops in which they will debate the effects of war on the present youth generation. The experience of German and European youth is essential as they are the fourth generation since World War II. They will discuss the consequences of the wars in both countries through rethinking the roles of monuments, memorials and commemorative practices in creating socio-cultural and political identities. The discussion will be informed by meetings with war veterans and local artists. Together they will explore the possibilities for the inclusion of war veterans in the Serbian historical narrative. By these intimate meetings, part of the informal education process, participants will be able to understand the effect of the historical event on their own lives and ask as to the motivation of the veterans (many youth at the time) for participating in the war; and their experiences during and after the war and their reflection on it now; in addressing these questions the youth will learn to act as cultural brokers, but also as promoters of peace and conflict resolution. The European intercultural discussion about war, commemoration, and social inclusion, will emphasize the role of youth as active participants in democracy. The group will propose possible designs for a commemorative site for Serbian veterans of the wars of the 1990s. The workshop will end in an exhibition to which a catalogue will be published. The exhibition will be covered by the media and presented on the partners' websites.

Special focus during project will be on youth participation in implementation of EU Bird and Habitat Directive and protection of endangered species in Europe. Objectives of this youth exchange are in cohesion with general objectives of the Youth in Action Programme, meaning that it will promote young active citizenship in general and European citizenship of participants in particular, with special retrospective on environmental protection. One of the main objectives is to foster mutual understanding between young people from Portugal, FYRO Macedonia, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Germany, Lithuania, Montenegro and Serbia as well as to promote European cooperation in the youth and environmental fields. These goals will be met by non-formal educational methods and activities as workshops, presentations, short lectures, practical activities with emphasis on matter-of-fact environmental activities like tree planting and junk cleaning. 35 young people and 9 youth leaders will participate in the youth exchange. This youth exchange will directly involve 14 young people with fewer opportunities. EEG will host the "EY - WWRE 5", which will take place in beautiful mountains of central Serbia near the town of Gornji Milanovac and it will last 9 days. This youth exchange is a part of four year long tradition in which we already organized four youth exchanges on this topic, always mixing new and previous partners, so the results which we got during the time can be used and improved. Thanks to good cooperation with project partners we decide to implement this project with new youth and in mix partnership for fifth time.

The participants will explore the above mentioned issues from the perspective of EU enlargement and essential reforms that have to be undertaken by SEEU countries in order to be considered for the EU membership in the future.</p> <p>The seminar will stabilize and enlarge the European Youth4Media network.
